Attendance

Research shows how massive the impact of attendance is on student achievement at school. Every day, hour and minute matters. Below is a chart that illustrates how small amounts of time away from school can have big impacts over the course of a child's school life.

How important is attendance?

1 or 2 days a week doesn't seem like much but ...

St John's Visit

Next week on Monday 22nd and Tuesday 23rd June we will have a visit from St John's. They will be running two programmes in each of the classrooms. Here is a brief of what they will be covering:



Responding to an Emergency: We always hope that our students

won't be involved in any emergencies. However, there are likely to be times during their lives when they need to respond to an emergency, and some of those may be when they are by themselves with an injured person. Confidence when responding to an emergency lowers the risks involved in bystander intervention. Teaching emergency responses to young people enables them to share their learning with their whanau, and this may result in more people being active helpers in an emergency. This module supports both individual and community learning and helps to establish learning partnerships among St John, the school, and the wider school community.

Injury Prevention: The key to injury prevention is becoming aware of potential hazards in the environment. It is about students being able to judge the level of risk and take steps to minimize the risk and therefore prevent injury. The aim of this module is for students to conclude that most injuries are preventable, and to identify methods for assessing and managing risk. We always hope that our students won't be injured. However, there are likely to be times during their lives when they are exposed to a potentially harmful situation, and they need to be able to think about prevention strategies for themselves and others, as well as ways to prevent further injury happening should an accident occur.


