At the heart of the Paparoa Community, we at Paparoa School are known for our whanaungatanga, our strong sense of belonging which provides a warm, welcoming family friendly, inclusive environment. Our modern, rural school is surrounded by paddocks, a bike track, our own orchard as well as having local access to the community hall, walkways and a mountain bike track.

Our school offers a mix of technology alongside a healthy rural school curriculum with small class sizes. This enables students to receive more 1:1 time with the teacher, individualised programmes and personalised authentic learning opportunities. Aiming high, we believe in 'panekiretanga, striving for the highest standards, achieving our goals, while supporting our tamariki to be challenged and enriched. We focus on quality rather than quantity!

A lot of change will be happening at Paparoa School over the next few years. A new Te Reo Maori and Tikanga programme will be introduced at the beginning of 2023, with the re-introduction of Kapa Haka. We are developing the Local Curriculum, where an Outdoor Education Programme will continue to be expanded to incorporate all aspects of the environment we live in. We are introducing Garden to Table, building our gardens to incorporate the natural habitat of insects and small animals. We are developing an agricultural programme for students to learn how to work with calves and participate in the Pet & Show Day. Extension subjects and languages are currently being investigated for students to participate in through the winter months.

To complement our learning and culture, we will be developing our indoor and outdoor spaces, making Paparoa School a place that is moving forward, a place to be proud of.

Come in and see us anytime, we welcome the opportunity to talk to you and your child. We will give you a tour around the school and discuss the unique opportunities a rural school delivers. Our door is always open.

SCHOOL POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Currently our school policies and procedures are getting changed over to digital and will be able to be viewed through schooldocs in 2023.

If you need to view any of these beforehand, they are available in the office.

TRANSITION TO SCHOOL

We think it is important to allow as much time as needed for your child to settle into the routine of school. We do not have set days for visiting, please contact us at least eight weeks before your child is due to start school and we can organise



visits. Generally we will start off with your child visiting for one block with mum, dad, grandma or grandad etc staying with them. It is important for your child to feel comfortable and safe when they are at school and an adult will support this, which will create a successful transition once they start full time. We will continue to build the time and independence through their visits. You know your child best, we will work with you.

ENROLLING

To enrol your child, you need to fill in the enrolment form, bring a Birth Certificate or current Passport and your child's immunisation record. (Well Child Booklet or ring doctors surgery for a copy). If you haven't already, the Principal will have a chat about the school and discuss any of your child's needs, answer your questions or concerns and have a tour.

STATIONERY

At Paparoa School, we ask that parents purchase school stationery requirements through the school office in the first week of school. Stationery lists will be made available from the school office. Please note that the school has no mark up on the stationery items provided. Students can 'top up' stationery items through the year, and an invoice will be issued to parents.

SCHOOL DONATIONS

At Paparoa School we are a part of the Ministry Donations Scheme. This means that parents are not asked for donations at the beginning of the year.

<u>School Hui</u>

Our School Hui (assemblies) will be held every second Friday afternoon from 1.45pm. We have a whole school assembly which is led by our senior students. We welcome any whanau to attend this event. The Hui is a celebration of learning, effort and achievement our tamariki have demonstrated over the previous two weeks.

<u>Meeting with Staff</u>

There will be formal events when you are able to meet with staff. If you need to speak with a teacher, we are happy to make time. All we ask is that if you do require time with teachers, please ensure this does not disrupt classroom learning. By all means, email or catch up with them before and after school.

@School Parent App

We have introduced a new communication app for parents, whanau and the school. This ETaP app connects with our school's administration system which will enable all absences to be recorded, messages can be sent as well as notifications of upcoming events. When you enrol your child, you will receive an email with instructions on how to set up this app. There are visual instructions on how to do this in the enrolment pack. If you need support with this, please see Jane in the office.



<u>Absenteeism</u>

The last few years have been a difficult time for all of us and being at school has been extremely disrupted. However, school is now on fulltime and students need to be attending. The Ministry of Education is running a variety of campaigns to support students going back to school and we are fully behind it. We are required by Ministry of Education regulations to input a satisfactory explanation for absences. If we are unable to contact you or we do not hear from you, your child will be identified as truant. Please, contact us on any of the communication methods (Email, Skool Loop, Facebook message, text or phone call) by 9.00am to let us know why your child is away from school. If you are having challenges getting your children to school, please come and talk to the Principal, we are here to help.

If your child is late or picked up early, please go to the office and either sign your child in or out.

<u>Change of Details</u>

Please inform the school promptly of any changes in your address, mobile number and email address. We must be able to contact you or a trusted caregiver in case of an emergency or illness. If you need to change your child's contact list, please ring the office.

SCHOOL BUS SERVICE

The Ministry of Education will not fund children's bus travel when families choose to send their child(ren) to a school other than the nearest appropriate one. The policy states that children under 10 years old who live more than 3.2km and children over 10 who live more than 4.8km from the nearest school are eligible for school transport. Eligible children are required to make their way to the nearest pick up point.

Bus Changes

Should your child/children be getting off the bus at a stop other than their usual or you wish for your child not to go on the bus for any reason, **the school <u>must</u> be notified** so we are able to make the changes to the bus lists which informs the drivers. This must be done by **2.00pm**.









Unfortunately the Fundraising Group was disbanded during the Covid years but in 2022 we are slowly getting it back together. In 2022 we had an organising committee that did an amazing job recreating the Possum Purge that had been cancelled since 2019. This event raised the school \$11,000 which for a small rural school is like 'liquid gold'. We talk about 'quality over quantity' at our school but to get the quality, we must fundraise to provide for the extra curricular activities, programmes and equipment. We rely on the school families to provide some time to support our school whether it be with fundraising events, working bees or cooking sausages on the BBQ! In 2023, the school will be creating a priority list of projects that will need fundraising support. We will be forming a fundraising committee to organise the events throughout the year. SUN SMART

Paparoa School has been accredited by the Cancer Society as a 'sun safe school'. Our tamariki may bring their own hat, but this too must be a wide-brimmed hat.
