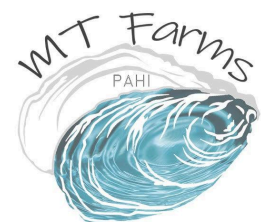

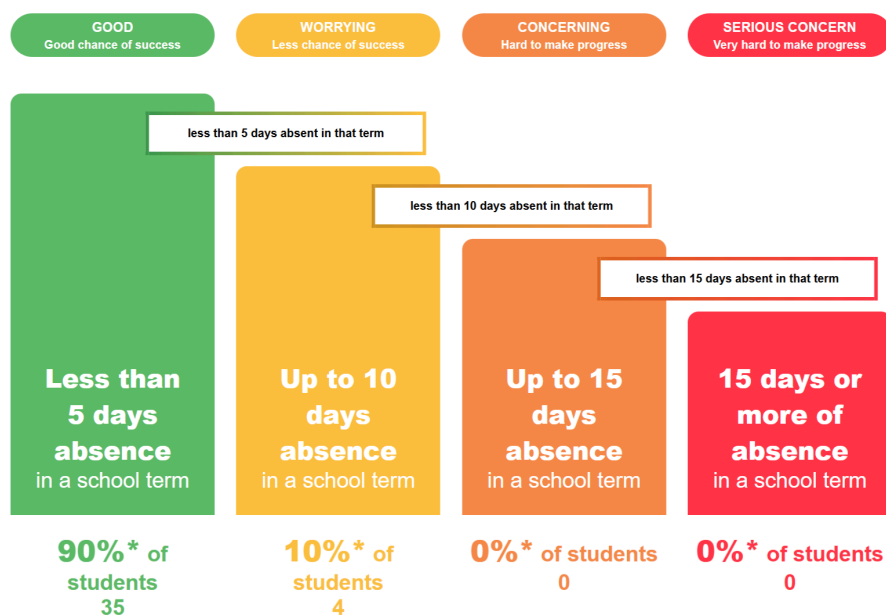

We have seen a rise in school sores among our students. School sores (impetigo) are skin infections. They are often called 'school sores' because they are common in school-aged tamariki and spread easily.

School sores can be anywhere on the body. But they most often appear on exposed areas such as: the face (near the mouth and nose), hands, arms and legs

If your child has school sores, they must stay home until one day after treatment has started. This could be with antiseptic cream or antibiotics.

Once your child is back at school, the sores must be kept covered until they are healed.
